FAQ

Our student services team lends support to learners to help them develop and achieve success. Learn more through our frequently asked questions.

Q: Can CLCA service my child's special needs?

A: Our student services team welcomes the opportunity to meet with families who have students currently receiving or potentially in need of certain services. Through those conversations, our team will help determine if we are able to service the required needs.

Q: How do I know if my child would qualify?

A: If your child has an IEP (Individualized Education Plan) or a 504 plan with the public school, they would qualify to receive services from our department. If you aren't sure - no problem. We will walk you through the process of finding out that information.

Q: Do I have to fill out different paperwork for enrollment purposes?

A: For the initial enrollment process, there's no additional paperwork needed, but there may be an additional meeting to find out more information.

Q: Do you work with the public school system?

A: While we do work with the public school system, we are a separate student services department with our own student services team. We have certain services we are able to offer, and ones we aren't able to at this time.
