This Week's Focus:

Theme: Transportation- Cars, Trucks, Bicycles

Bible Lesson: Jesus Turns Water into Wine



Fine Motor Development: This week, children are building fine motor skills through hands-on activities that strengthen small hand muscles and coordination. Gluing, sorting, coloring, painting with cars, and manipulating play-dough all help develop grasp, control, and hand-eye coordination while children engage in fun, meaningful learning experiences.

Social/Language: This week, children are developing social and language skills by sharing about their own cars and bikes, listening to others, and participating in group discussions. Cooperative activities, such as building a city together and talking about stoplight colors and meanings, encourage turn-taking, communication, and vocabulary development related to vehicles, colors, and everyday experiences.

Math: This week, children are building math skills by sorting and matching colors, counting objects like Fruit Loops, and identifying patterns as they create crafts. They also practice early problem-solving and spatial awareness while building roads and cities with play-dough and exploring how colors mix together.

Science: This week, children are developing science skills by exploring cause and effect as they paint with cars and observe how colors mix to make new ones. They also learn about how stoplights work and experiment with color changes in the Bible craft, helping them build early observation, prediction, and inquiry skills.

This week's Focus

Theme: Transportation- Cars, Trucks, and Bikes

Bible Lesson: Jesus turns water into wine

Fine Motor Development: Stickers, gluing, cutting, coloring

Literacy: Letter "N"

Science: In science, our preschoolers are exploring the exciting topic of transportation! We are learning about different types of vehicles, such as cars, trucks, and bikes, and how they help people travel from one place to another. Through hands-on activities, stories, and play, children are discovering how vehicles move, what they are used for, and how they are the same or different. This unit encourages curiosity, builds vocabulary, and helps children understand the world around them while connecting science learning to their everyday experiences.

Math. In math, our preschoolers are focusing on the number one! Children are learning to recognize the number 1 and understand that it represents one object. Through fun activities like number scrambles, they practice identifying the number one by carefully looking at a group of numbers and coloring all the number ones they find. These activities help build number recognition, attention to detail, and early counting skills while making learning engaging and hands-on.

Our class has done a solid job at coming back to school after a long break. We all continue to work hard at staying in our own space and worrying about our own business. Matthew 3:13-17 (13) Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptized by John. (14) But John tried to deter him, saying, “I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?” (15) Jesus replied, “Let it be so now; it is proper for us to do this to fulfill all righteousness.” Then John consented. (16) As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment, heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and lighting on him. (17) And a voice from heaven said, “This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased.”

This past Sunday was the day in the church year on which we celebrate Jesus' baptism. It may seem unusual that Jesus was baptized. Jesus was the holy Son of God. He had no sins that needed to be forgiven. So why was he baptized? Jesus' baptism set him aside for his work as our Savior from sin. John the Baptist

had pointed to Jesus and said, “Look, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.” (John 1:29). God the Father now proclaims, “Thus is my Son whom I love; with him I am well pleased.” (Matthew 3:17) Isaiah said of Jesus, “The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is one me, because the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the poor.” There was no more waiting for the Savior. Jesus was that Savior. Jesus’ baptism set him aside as our substitute. Jesus would keep God’s law perfectly in our place. Jesus would die and suffer the torments of hell we deserved for our sins in our place. Jesus’ resurrection proved that his redemptive work counts for us. May we always remember Jesus’ baptism and look to him as our Savior and substitute who won salvation for us.

Subject Work This Week

- Bible History: We see every one of God’s promises fulfilled as he leads his people into the land of Canaan.
 - Doctrine: The First Article introduces us to God, our Father in heaven. God richly and daily provides us with all that we need for our bodies and life. In response, we thank, praise, serve, and obey him in all that we do.
 - Memory Work: Monday - Passages 13-14; Wednesday - Passages 15-16; Next Monday - Passages 17-18
 - 5-6 Geography: Country presentations are this week. Be sure to be ready on your scheduled day.
 - 5-6 History: We are studying life in Early America. Many cultural groups settled in Early America. We will be comparing and contrasting these groups. **The students will be assigned a history project** for January 20 that requires them to research the culture of a tribe or tribal group in Early America. It would be wise to start early.
 - 7-8 History: The Revolutionary War was won. The Constitution was written. But now America had to grow and thrive on its own. America faced many obstacles from foreign powers and within its borders. America’s leaders helped America not only to survive, but to thrive at this time. **This Week - the War of 1812.** A unit history project has been assigned for January 20. Students are encouraged to start early on their project.
 - Literature: We will be reading the novel *Indian Captive* during the next quarter. The novel takes place during the French and Indian War and looks at the war from the perspective of the Native Americans who were caught in the middle. During the unit, the students will be asked to evaluate the growth of characters. Students will have daily assignments, but they should keep at their character growth charts. At the end of the unit, the students will be writing a paper about what they learned from the novel. Charts will be given to fill in during the novel to assist with the paper. It is important that students keep up with their charts.

Bible History/Hymnology: 7th grade will be having Doctrine every day this week. Pastor Krause will then be out for the next two weeks, where we will dive back into the book of Acts.

7th Grade Literature: The class has started a new novel, *Among the Hidden*. We dove into this dystopian world and continue to discuss themes of courage, integrity, and making wise choices even in difficult situations.

5th Math: We will take our assessment on dividing whole numbers and then start a new chapter where we will work on dividing numbers with decimals.

6th Math: We will continue to write and solve algebraic expressions.

7th Math: We will continue to explore ratios and rates.

-We are wrapping up the first 9 chapters of Joshua this week, and getting into Rahab next. Our memory work passage for the week is Romans 1:16-17.

The class has been struggling with mastering their memory work so far this school year. It seems like many students wait until the last minute to study, and then "cram" the passage and forget it. Before considering any increase in consequences for not knowing the memory work, I'd like to encourage parents to spend a few minutes asking about the passages we study each week. Our devotions focus on understanding who is speaking, to whom they are speaking, what the context of the passage is, and how we can use that passage to share God's word with others. If students are in school and paying attention during devotion, they should know that information by Wednesday. I would love it if you would support the spiritual growth we strive for with memory work by practicing or talking about the highlighted passages each week.

-A skill that has been added to our work in literature class is the summarization of informational articles. We have an assessment scheduled for Wednesday that will address those summarization skills, among other skills. The articles we are studying all center around how refugees are impacted by having to leave home and trying to find a new home.

-We had a nice trip over to the high school last week to see what offerings are available to students if they choose to attend FAHS. Today, Mrs. Uptahl came over to meet with those 8th graders to get more in-depth with courses and paths to take over their career at FAHS.
