This Week's Focus:

Theme: Mail Carriers/Librarians

Bible Lesson: God gives his people Jericho

<u>Fine Motor Development</u>: This week, children will build their fine motor skills through hands-on activities that involve cutting, gluing, folding, and manipulating small materials. As they create their mail truck craft, they'll strengthen hand-eye coordination and control by positioning and gluing shapes. Folding paper and drawing in their own books will further develop finger strength and precision. During the "Brown Bear, Brown Bear" matching game, children will practice grasping and placing small colored circles accurately on the grid. Each of these playful experiences supports fine motor development while encouraging creativity and engagement

<u>Social/Language</u>: This week, children will strengthen their social and language skills through opportunities for conversation, collaboration, and storytelling. As they discuss their mail truck creations and share about the books they make, they'll practice expressing ideas and using new vocabulary. Group activities like reading "Lola at the Library" and participating in the "Brown Bear, Brown Bear" matching game encourage listening, turn-taking, and responding to others. Singing songs together and talking about community helpers further support language development while fostering positive social interaction and cooperation.

<u>Math:</u> Children will practice math skills this week by exploring shapes, counting, and patterns in playful ways. While creating their mail truck craft, they'll identify and arrange different shapes and sizes. Folding paper to make books introduces concepts of halves and sequencing. During the "Brown Bear, Brown Bear" activity, they'll match colors and animals, reinforcing color recognition, one-to-one correspondence, and spatial awareness. Through these engaging experiences, children build early math understanding while connecting learning to real-world themes.

Science: Children will build science skills this week by exploring how things work and observing the world around them. As they learn about mail carriers and librarians, they'll discuss community roles and how people help others—introducing basic social science concepts. Creating mail trucks encourages thinking about how vehicles move and function, while making and sharing their own books supports curiosity and observation about materials and how they can be used. Outdoor reading time also allows children to notice and talk about nature, using their senses to explore their environment.

Literacy: Review Letters "F-J"

Science: This week in preschool science, we are learning about community helpers—specifically, mail carriers and librarians! We will focus on helping children explore and understand the roles people play in our community and how they use tools and systems to do their jobs. Through hands-on activities, we'll investigate how mail is sorted and delivered, discuss how information and books are organized in a library, and compare the ways these helpers use communication and organization in their work. These lessons encourage curiosity, observation, and critical thinking while helping children see how science and problem-solving are part of everyday life.

<u>Math</u>. Children will practice math skills this week by exploring shapes, counting, and patterns in playful ways. While creating their mail truck craft, they'll identify and arrange different shapes and sizes. During the "Brown Bear, Brown Bear" activity, they'll match colors and animals, reinforcing color recognition, one-to-one correspondence, and spatial awareness. Through these engaging experiences, children build early math understanding while connecting learning to real-world themes.

I am looking forward to our Parent-Teacher Conferences this week. There is so much to celebrate!

Here is a sneak peek at what we are learning...

Math: composing and decomposing numbers, chapter 5 assessment, and learning new math games!

Phonics: mastering foundational skills such as rhyming, blending, and segmenting phonemes, isolating and manipulating sounds/words; work on decodable reading passages, spelling CVC words, and learning short o. We are adding two "snap words" this week: *from* and *your*.

Reading: We begin a new reading unit called: My Community Heroes where we will answer the essential question: What Makes a Community? We will make and check predictions, build our listening comprehension, describe characters, and learn text features.

Writing: We are learning about nouns and pronouns for grammar. We will illustrate pictures using the whole space and adding lots of details! We will add labels and practice writing simple sentences using our high-frequency words.

Social Studies: We are back to social studies! We begin the new unit on Communities and Community Helpers. This will integrate very well with reading and writing. This week will focus on community helpers.

Christ Light: This week, we will learn that God wants us to follow his direction rather than our own. God's plan is always greater than ours!

What we are learning in 4th Grade:

Christ Light: This week we will be studying Jacob traveling to Egypt and the birth of Moses. In both lessons we will see how God cares for us each and every day.

We'll wrap up our short week with a review of the last 40 root words we've studied in an unscramble game!





- → Doctrine: God protects his gift of marriage with the Sixth Commandment. God gives life, and he instituted marriage. Therefore, his rules, not ours, govern marriage, gender, and the place for sex. God tells us that marriage is for life between one man and one woman, with the husband being the leader and the wife his helper. When marriage functions as God intended it to, he promises his blessing on it.
- → Memory Work: As we begin preparing for the Christmas sacred service, there will be memory work on most days. Your child has the Christmas study guide sheet and will be able to tell you which section is due the next day.
- → 5-6 Geography: We will be reviewing the map skills we have learned. There is a test on Tuesday.
- → 5-6 History: We are looking at the impact Islam has had on the Middle East. Islam is not only a religion, but also a major influencer in the politics of the Middle East.
- → 7-8 History: America won its independence and needed to decide what kind of government it would have. We frequently hear that our country is a democracy. Our government was never called that until the early 1900s. The term democracy applies if we think about the rights and freedoms we enjoy. That is not what our founding fathers intended. They warned vehemently against democracies because, in a pure democracy, the majority rules and the rights of those in the minority are taken away. What we were given was a constitutional republic in which we elect representatives, and the rights of all are protected by constitutional laws so that no one group can take away our freedoms. This week: The development of Congress.

Continue working on your citizenship essay. <u>DO NOT USE AI</u>. This is a personal essay describing how you feel about your country and your citizenship.

→ Literature: We are continuing to grow in our literature skills. The amount of information is significant at this point. The students need to review their literature skills daily. It is the same as knowing math facts in math. We are covering the forms of fiction on page 11 of the study guide. We will be reading short stories. The daily assignments require slow, careful attention.
