This Week's Focus:

Theme: Apples

Bible Lesson: God Saves Noah and His Family

Fine Motor Development: Tissue Paper Art, Apple Stamping, Sticker Peeling/Pasting, Coloring

<u>Social/Language:</u> Singing Apple Songs, Using descriptive words to describe apples (cold, round, big, small, red), Turn taking, sharing, following step by step instructions.

<u>Math:</u> Recognizing shapes, creating patterns, sorting colors, and counting objects like apple prints or stickers. They also build spatial awareness and sequencing skills as children decide where to place items and in what order..

<u>Science:</u> Apple stamping, tissue paper art, and sticker activities help preschoolers develop early science skills by encouraging observation, experimentation, and cause-and-effect thinking. Through hands-on exploration, children learn about textures, patterns, color mixing, and material properties, while also building fine motor control and spatial awareness.

Routines, Procedures, and Lots of Fun!



Full 5 days of learning coming our way this week! Please be patient with your Kindergartener if he/she is coming home tired and possibly crabby. We are putting in a lot of brain work during class time and at recess WE PLAY HARD. With the students giving me their all, this may leave you with their empty tank. School stamina will grow, hang in there!

Math has us using the words greater than, less than, and equal to when describing amounts. Phonics has us learning /f/ and /i/. Reading has us asking the question: What kinds of work do people do? Writing creates stamina so that we can put our newly learned worlds into sentences . Science kicks off with the 5 Senses while we discover what science is and who are scientists. ChristLight introduces us to Abrahams and his amazing trust in God's plan for his life. We also discover how Abraham's trust shines through in his actions.

Our stamina is growing! This will be our first 5 day week in kindergarten. We will continue to practice and get REALLY good at our school routines and procedures. A few reminders...please remember to check your child's folder each Friday and return to school on Monday, and please make sure you are labeling your child's clothing. The mornings start chilly but as the temps warm up we have students misplacing their sweaters in the afternoon. Third reminder...please pack silverware in your child's lunch. We run out of spoons and forks quickly and sometimes they don't have one.

Here is a sneak peek at what we are learning...

Math: comparing numbers and using vocabulary "greater than" and "less than"

Phonics: blending VC/CVC words and learning p /p/ and f /f/

Reading: exploring a fiction text, practice retelling a story (including the beginning, middle, and end) and answering text-dependent questions. This week we will be comparing and contrasting two versions of the Three Billy Goats Gruff.

Writing: We are storytellers! We will practice dictating stories.

Science: We are starting our first science unit where we will study the seasons, sunlight, and weather.

Christ Light: This week we will learn about how God keeps his promises and answers prayers. We will learn about Abraham's trust in God. Bible Stories: Abraham Shares His Land; God Answers Abraham's Prayers for a Son; God Answers Abraham's Prayers for Lot.

What we are learning in 4th Grade:

Christ Light: This week has us studying Abraham and Lot and how we can show our faith by acting unselfishly toward others. We will also learn about how God promises Abraham a son. This will help to remind us that God also keeps his promises to us.

Reading: We will continue our study into cause and effect with the story My Librarian is a Camel. It was interesting to see how students in remote areas of the world get books to read. Ask your son or daughter about their favorite method! We will also begin reading groups this week. We will incorporate our cause and effect strategy in that reading.

Grammar: Grammar will have us looking at fragments and run-on sentences.

Writing: We will continue our study on writing a good paragraph. Students will practice using a T-chart to organize their thoughts and ideas into paragraphs. We will also fill out our own T-chart in anticipation of writing our paragraph.

Math: Math has us entering into Chapter 2 and adding and subtracting multi-digit numbers. We will also work on our math facts using a program called Xtra Math. Your son/daughter will be coming home with their login information. I would encourage you to have them practice each week. This will build their math confidence and skills.

Social Studies: We will be diving into Pre-Columbian peoples in North America. Students will get the opportunity to look at different Native American cultures and how the environment affected each group.

Thoughts from God's Word

Daniel 6:4-8 "The administrators...could find no corruption in him, because he was trustworthy and neither corrupt nor negligent....We will find no basis for charges against this man, Daniel, unless it has something to do with the law of his God."

We live in a world where we often do not trust government officials because we have seen many who have been corrupt or unfaithful in their government jobs. Daniel worked high up in the Persian government. He was so good at his job that other officials were jealous. When Daniel was investigated, they found that he was faithful and honest in all he did. If our lives were investigated, would people say the same thing about us? God searches and knows us inside out. There is nothing we can hide from him. We would have to admit that we are not faithful. In fact, we have been faithless in our dealings with God and each other. But God sees us through Christ's redemptive work and declares us to be holy and perfect. Like Daniel, may God help us to reflect that status in all we do.

Subject Work This Week

- → **Bible History:** Abraham was called by God to leave everything behind and go to an unknown land. God assured Abraham with many promises. Abraham believed God, and God counted it as saving faith.
- → **Doctrine:** In the First Commandment, God tells us to make him first chair in our hearts. We do this by worshipping, serving, loving, and trusting in him alone.
