Monday we count the 30th day of school for Kindergarten. Time is scooting by so quickly! We have grown in so many skills. Academically, we are in a groove and this is fun for me to watch. What we are learning in 4th Grade:

Christ Light: This week we will focus on Jacob and the trials in his life. We will emphasize still how God has a plan for our lives and we only need to trust his plan.



Memory work-Tuesday, October 7th; Psalm 37:5 and 3rd Article of the Apostles' Creed with the explanation and Thursday, October 9th; 1 Peter 5:7 and 1 John 1:7b. Please work on these with your scholar at home. I did tell them today that starting 2nd quarter they will have to redo any Memory work that doesn't get at least half correct. If you need some strategies for helping at home, please let me know.

Reading: We will begin reading a tall tale entitled <u>Stormalong</u>. We will discuss how tall tales are passed down and what a tall tale is. Our emphasis this week will be on understanding characters and inference and prediction.

Grammar: Following our week on verbs, we will look at verb tenses.

Writing: We will continue looking at supporting ideas for our paragraphs and emphasizing how they need to be parallel and relate back to the topic. We will review our supporting ideas and determine if they need correcting. We will then get into adding the detail to those supporting ideas.

Math: We begin chapter 3 this week and will work on multiplying by one-digit numbers. I would encourage you to work on their multiplication facts at home using flashcards or create your own flashcards to do this with. Knowing the multiplication facts helps tremendously with math! Also please continue to work on those math facts using the Xtra math. We have had a few students pass the addition! Work towards that goal of 40 minutes each month.

Social Studies: We will be diving into Pre-Columbian peoples in North America. Students will get the opportunity to look at different Native American cultures and how the environment affected each group.



Mark 4:3 "A farmer went out to sow his seed."

Farming practices were different in Jesus' time. A farmer would take a bag of seed to his field, put his hand in the bag, grab a handful of seed, and throw it out onto the field. The seed did not always land in the best places. It might land on the rock-hard path, in the thorns, or where the soil was rocky. But the farmer did not care. He simply sowed the seed generously, we might even say recklessly. That seed is God's Word. The different types of soil are different types of hearts. Like the farmer, we spread the seed of God's Word generously. We allow the Word to take root in people's hearts and produce fruits of faith. Be generous with the Word. Everyone needs to hear it.

Subject Work This Week

- → **Bible History:** Abraham was getting old, and his son Isaac needed a wife who was a believer. Abraham made sure that this happened so that Isaac's faith in the promised Savior would remain strong. By surrounding ourselves with fellow believers and studying the Word of God together, our faith also remains strong.
- → **Doctrine:** In the Third Commandment, God directs our worship life and the study of his Word. We do not have specific rules about when to worship God or customs to follow. God tells us that our whole life is a life of worship to him. To do that, we need to surround ourselves with his Word daily.
- → **Memory Work:** Monday Passages 19-20; Wednesday Passages 21-22; Thursday Third Commandment; next Monday Passages 23-25
- → **5–6 History/Geography:** We are studying a variety of maps. The African country tourism slides are due on Friday. We will continue our study of Southeast Asia.
- → **7–8 History:** The colonies had survived the French and Indian War. The war had been costly, and the King of England expected the colonies to help pay for their defense. The colonies did not necessarily oppose taxes. They just wanted a say in their government if they were being taxed. Lines were drawn both in England and the colonies over the issue that led up to the Revolutionary War.
- → **Literature:** We are reading the novel *Where the Red Fern Grows*. The students have a guide packet to fill out with each chapter. The students will be able to use their notes for quizzes on the novel. This week, we are reading Chapters 16-19.

- Exciting news! All 5th–8th grade math students will be taking part in a nationwide WELS Math
 Meet, competing with other schools across the United States. The competition will take place 4
 times this school year, with the first starting this Friday during their regular math class—good luck
 to all our amazing math scholars!

Bible History/Hymnology: This week will begin with Bible history by praising God through the singing of the worship song "Your Way's Better".

In **Acts Chapter 7 and 8** We will study Stephen and Israel's history, accusing the leaders of resisting God and betraying Jesus. Angered, they stone him, making Stephen the first Christian martyr as he prays for his killers. Persecution scatters the believers, spreading the gospel beyond Jerusalem. Philip preaches in Samaria, converting many, including Simon the sorcerer. He later explains Scripture to an Ethiopian official and baptizes him before continuing to preach elsewhere.

7th Grade Literature: We continue to read and study our first novel, *Black Radishes* by Susan Lynn Meyer. This powerful historical story, set in Nazi-occupied France, offers engaging characters and a compelling plot while exploring themes of courage, identity, and resilience. I am so proud of our eager readers—this novel has quickly become a favorite in the 7th-grade classroom!

5th Math: The class will continue to study adding and subtracting with decimals.

6th Math: The class is currently mastering multiplying and dividing decimals and will then prepare for their Chapter 2 test early next week.

7th Math: The class is currently preparing for their test on Chapter 2 which will be on Tuesday. They will then start a new chapter on algebraic expressions.

8th Math: The class will continue working on writing and graphing equations in slope-intercept form.

Science Notes for Middle School

-5th & 6th graders are taking an assessment this week, aimed toward our guiding question: "What determines an organism's traits at the molecular level?" The 7th & 8th graders will be reaching their final answer for their own guiding question before Friday, which asks, "Why do populations change size in an ecosystem?"

8th Grade Notes

-In Religion class, we are continuing our study of Genesis with the accounts of Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph. That will take us a few weeks, with a final assessment coming before the end of the 1st quarter this month. The memory passages for this week are Psalm 46:4-5

-We will be finishing up our reading of *A Midsummer Night's Dream* either this week or next. That will lead us into our culminating project: a character confession about whether it's possible to control someone else, and why you would even want to in the first place.

-If you were unable to make it to sing with us at Bethany Lutheran Church yesterday, there's still a chance to join us this coming Sunday! Please consider signing up with the link on the first page of the Crown Chronicles to bring your children to sing at Abiding Shepherd in Cottage Grove.

-Last Friday, we got an opportunity to have an 8th-grade-only assembly at the end of the day. Mrs. Moore and I talked the students through their goals as "R.U.L.E.R.S." of the school. Students spent some time identifying one of the ten goals they want to work on over the next month, as well as picking a step or two toward achieving that goal. Mrs. Moore and I also gave the students some items to consider this month: seeing how much they could stay off their phones over the weekends and just enjoy being home, and respecting the privacy of their classmates by not sharing or repeating information at school that might hurt feelings or damage reputations. We appreciate the partnership we have with you as parents to help your students meet those goals and work from both sides of their schedule to make CLCA a place where all students can feel safe.
