This Week's Focus:



Theme: Pumpkins

Bible Lesson: Joseph Becomes a Ruler in a Faraway Land

<u>Fine Motor Development</u>: This week, we are developing fine motor skills through activities that involve placing and gluing paper squares onto contact paper, coloring within a circular space, squeezing glue bottles, spraying water, and gluing small objects like googly eyes—all of which strengthen hand muscles and improve coordination.

<u>Social/Language</u>: This week, we are building social and language skills by sharing materials, taking turns, and engaging in conversations with teachers and peers. Children are using descriptive language to talk about their creations, colors, and shapes, helping them develop communication and vocabulary.

Songs: 5 Little Pumpkins (with props and interactive movement), 5 Crows all Shiny and Black (with props and interactive movement), I Picked One Pumpkin (Laurie Berkner Band), Pumpkin Pie Song (Danny Go)

<u>Math:</u> This week, we are developing early math skills by exploring shapes, sizes, and spatial relationships while creating our pumpkin craft. Children are sorting and comparing orange and yellow pieces, recognizing patterns, counting materials, and using position words like "top" and "center," all of which build a strong foundation for mathematical thinking.

<u>Science</u>: This week, we are developing early science skills through hands-on exploration of light, color, and materials. Children observe how sunlight shines through their finished pumpkins, noticing how the colors change and overlap, introducing concepts like transparency and color mixing. They also explore cause and effect by spraying water on marker-colored filters, watching how the colors blend and spread. Through observation, prediction, and comparison, children are encouraged to think like young scientists and develop curiosity about the world around them.

**This week, we are focusing on Hearts and the colors red, yellow, and brown.

Routines, Procedures, and Lots of Fun!

This week is exciting because we get to head out to Busy Barns on Wednesday and RIDE A BUS! Thank you for dressing your child in their green field trip shirt. Please make sure their bottoms are appropriate for running around outside and possibly getting dirty. The weather looks to be in our favor, but please dress your child accordingly.

Here is a sneak peek at what we are learning...

Math: comparing numbers to 10 by matching and counting, using math vocabulary words like greater than, less than, and equal to

Phonics: mastering foundational skills such as rhyming, blending, and segmenting phonemes, isolating and manipulating sounds/words; we will learn two new snap words: is and I, and we will be reviewing short Ii /i/

Reading: We are answering the question "What makes each of us special?" again this week. We will identify characters, setting, and find the problem and solution. Books we will be reading: Snail and Worm Again and Pete the Cat Too Cool for School.

Writing: We are storytellers! We will practice dictating stories and illustrating stories. We will learn all about sentences & creating sentences. We will identify a sentence vs. a fragment. In Grammar, we will learn about pronouns.

Science: We will finish up our unit studying the seasons, sunlight, and weather.

Christ Light: This week, we will learn to rely on God when sad or scary things happen. We can trust in his love and power. We will also learn how we can use our gifts and abilities to praise God!

What we are learning in 4th Grade:

Christ Light: In our Christ Light lessons this week, we get to look at the life of Joseph and how God used the trials in his life for his glory.

Memory work-Tuesday, October 14th; Hebrews 13:5b and 8th Commandment with Explanation and Thursday, October 16th; Proverbs 3:% and 10th Commandment with Explanation. Please work on these with your scholar at home. I did tell them today that starting in the 2nd quarter, they will have to redo any Memory work that doesn't get at least half correct. If you need some strategies for helping at home, please let me know.

Reading: We will continue looking at our Tall Tale Stormalong and making connections to our lives. We will read a folktale that connects to our story and talk about why people pass down these types of stories.

Grammar: This week has us looking at progressive verb tenses.

Writing: We will begin adding details to our supporting ideas. We will talk about how even those details need to connect back to our supporting ideas and our topic. We will begin writing our own details for our supporting ideas.

Math: We will continue working on multiplying by one-digit numbers and learning various strategies to help us with that. I again encourage you to practice their multiplication facts at home. Knowing these facts will help greatly!

Social Studies: We will be learning how to research topics well and how to navigate the internet for good research. This will lead us into researching our Pre-Columbian Groups that we have spent the last couple of weeks learning about.

CHRIST LIGHT: We'll read the story of Joseph sold by his brothers and his time in Egypt. God continues to bless despite the troubles—they only serve to strengthen our faith in Him! We'll recite **Matthew 5:16** on Wednesday. The Memory Work link is **HERE**.

ELA 5+6: The final sketchnotes are the focus this week! What GREAT learning I'm seeing in their work-truly showing growth all around in their vocabulary and application of the words. In writing, we'll work on formatting our opinion writing into paragraphs with a strong thesis statement. In grammar, we'll tackle those tricky adverbs.

ELA 7+8: We're cruising through our Roots studies with our next focus called "A Time and Place" featuring CHRON, TEMP, and LOC. We'll work on formatting our argumentative essay into paragraphs with a strong thesis statement today. I'm really pushing them to find credible sources and evidence, eliminating weak claims. In grammar, the class will review common, proper, abstract, and concrete nouns through a mentor sentence.

LITERATURE: We finished the book-what a great ending it was! Check out the flyer below for info on our class Pie Party to celebrate. We have PLENTY of pies already, but if your family would still like to send one in-go for it! Before we slice up the goodness, I'll be asking the class to show their learning with a few project choices about the book. We'll have work time in class for three days, but they may need to work on it at home, too! Encourage them to dive back into the book to find evidence of their answers.

1 Peter 1:25 - "The word of the Lord endures forever."

So many things change over time. The way our jobs are performed may change. Technology may become more or less important in our daily lives. The needs of our families change as our children grow. Subject Work This Week

- → **Bible History:** Jacob was far from home. For twenty years, he learned patience and trust in God while he stayed with his Uncle Laban. Jacob learned that God would care for him no matter what circumstances came into his life. God had forgiven his sins; therefore, Jacob could rely on God for everything.
- → **Doctrine:** In the Third Commandment, God directs our worship life and the study of His Word. We do not have specific rules about when to worship God or customs to follow. God tells us that our whole life is a life of worship to him. To do that, we need to surround ourselves with His Word daily.
- → **Memory Work:** Monday Passages 21-22; Wednesday Passages 23-25; next Monday Passages 1-2
- → **5–6 History/Geography:** We are studying a variety of maps. The African country reports start on Thursday. We will finish our study of Southeast Asia this week.
- → **7–8 History:** The colonies had survived the French and Indian War. The war had been costly, and the King of England expected the colonies to help pay for their defense. The colonies did not necessarily oppose taxes. They just wanted a say in their government if they were being taxed. Lines were drawn both in England and the colonies over the issue that led up to the Revolutionary War. Test on Tuesday.
- → **Literature:** We are reading the novel *Where the Red Fern Grows*. The students have a guide packet to fill out with each chapter. The students will be able to use their notes for quizzes on the novel. This week, we are taking our final testing on the book on Tuesday and Wednesday. Be sure to have study guides at school.

Bible History/Hymnology: This week will begin with an introduction to our new worship song, "What an Awesome God" by Phil Wickham.

We will do a review of Chapters 7-8 of Acts and then study Chapter 9 of Acts-looking into the conversion of Paul and the road to Damascus.

7th Grade Literature: We continue to read and study our first novel, *Black Radishes* by Susan Lynn Meyer. This powerful historical story, set in Nazi-occupied France, offers engaging characters and a compelling plot while exploring themes of courage, identity, and resilience. I am so proud of our eager readers—this novel has quickly become a favorite in the 7th-grade classroom!

5th Math: The class will continue studying how to add and subtract decimals and will finish the week with a quiz to review what they've learned.

6th Math: The class is reviewing how to multiply and divide decimals and will have a test on these skills later this week.

7th Math: The students are continuing their study of algebraic terms and will begin learning how to add and subtract these terms. They'll practice combining like terms and applying these skills to simplify algebraic expressions.

8th Math: The class will continue working on writing and graphing equations in both slope-intercept form and standard form. There will be a quiz early next week to check their understanding of these concepts.

Science Notes for Middle School

8th Grade Notes

It's an ongoing discussion that I'm enjoying with the students as they continue to peel back the layers of our guiding question. The memory passages for this week are Psalm 23:1-3.
- -We reached the climax of our play, full of 500-year-old insults, mud, and magic. We will be moving through the final acts a bit more quickly so we can get to our final writing project before the end of the quarter. We have also been watching the movie and just took a test comparing the two formats. While it's a PG-13 movie, we have been skipping the PG-13 parts during class. If you decide to watch it at home, please read the parental guidance notes first!
