

NOTE: A couple additional things are coming home today. First, a homework sheet they can use to practice reading, which uses the short a sound that we practiced last week as well as the irregular words. The goal of these is to encourage fluent reading (without stopping to sound out words) so they can comprehend what they read. These are good to practice to build up those skills. They do not need to be returned but the student is welcome to bring them back if they want to show me (and get it stickered 😊)

Second, math worksheets which may only look partially done. That is OK! During math, we do a lot of hands-on activities and whole group learning, so the worksheets will not always get done to completion. They are more of an opportunity for me to gauge where our independent understanding is at the end of the lesson.

Math: Addition and partner numbers.

Reading: What are the elements of a story (characters, setting, events)

Social Studies/Science: Introduction to Science with the question: What is Science?

Writing: Practicing sentences and building sentences with prompts

Phonics: Short i in CVC and CCVC words such as sit and crib

What we are learning in 4th Grade:

Christ Light: This week we will read about Cain and Abe and talk about how the sin of jealousy can affect our lives. We will also read the account of the Flood and the amazing promise God gave to Noah, his family, and to us as believers.

Reading: Our unit this week will focus on Civil Rights. We will read a selection entitled [My Brother Martin](#). We will work on how to determine why an author wrote their selection and for what purpose we are reading it. We will connect the history of the Civil Rights movement while reading.

Grammar: In grammar we will be reviewing 4 kinds of sentences and how to determine what our sentences are. We will also work on how to incorporate those 4 kinds of sentences into our writing.

Writing: Our writing will continue to focus on a descriptive paragraph. This week we will work on how to write a topic sentence, our body of the paragraph, and a strong conclusion sentence.

Math: Math this week will find us rounding multi-digit numbers. We will review chapter 1 and take a test on Friday to demonstrate what we have learned.

Social Studies: Our geography discussion will continue this week including how immigration patterns have been affected throughout history. We will also look at how people have adapted or changed the environment. In state history we will discuss how we tell our state's story as well as create our own 'state symbols' book.

LEARN AND GROW

→ **CHRIST LIGHT:** The Fall and the Promise is our Bible story study of the week. I'll include the link [HERE](#) to memory work for the year. Memory Work #1 will be recited on Wednesday. We spent time this week creating a mini poster of the passage. These are great to hang around the house to review each week.

- **ELA 5+6:** One round of Sketchnotes in the books! We've been diving into different suffixes that end words. I assigned a BIG set of five that we'll be working on this week. They will be due next Monday. In writing, we'll be diving into some writing prompts to get the creative juices flowing. In grammar, we'll dive into adjectives and practice labeling nouns with an interactive slide on our chromebooks.
- **ELA 7+8:** This week we'll test on Roots 1 on Thursday. In writing, we will practice being concise with wording so that it makes the most sense. In grammar, we're wrapping up the Scavenger Hunt and will start some comics to review the parts of speech.
- **LITERATURE:** We will be reading the story "The Hundred Dresses" to explore summarizing and making inferences with our background knowledge + what information we read.

Thoughts from God's Word

Mark 5:36 "Don't be afraid; just believe."

In Mark 5, we meet three desperate people - a demon-possessed man, a father with a sick child, and a woman with a bleeding disorder. Their desperate situations led them to fall at Jesus' feet for help, and he helped them. Not only was their earthly medical problem solved, but more importantly, Jesus renewed their faith in him as their Savior. That is why Jesus told Jairus, "Don't be afraid; just believe." (Mark 5:36) Jesus does the same thing to us. He allows our lives not to go smoothly. He permits difficulty and tragedy to strike. He does this not to harm us, but because he loves us and wants to drive us to his Word and to himself, the source of our salvation. "Our help is in the name of the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth." (Psalm 124:8) While we pray that God would keep evil away (and he does), we pray even more so that God would work all things, even the worst things in life, for our spiritual good (and he does).

Announcements

- Winston Churchill once said, "It is...the end of the beginning." That is true of where we are in the school year. The students are off to a great start. Students have gotten a feel for the flow of classes and the expectations for the school year. Labor Day marks a key transition point. The newness is gone, and we are excited to hit the ground running as we tackle the flow and workload of the school year.

Subject Work This Week

- **Bible History:** It did not take mankind long to demonstrate that he had lost the image of God in which he was created. In love, God sent the flood so that his promise to send the Savior would not die out.
- **Doctrine:** We are studying the basics of the Bible. God's Word was written that we may believe Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and by believing we might have life in his name.
- **Memory Work:** Tuesday - Old Testament books of the Bible; Wednesday - Passages 5-6; Thursday - New Testament books of the Bible, Next Monday - Passages 7-8
- **5-6 History/Geography:** We are studying cardinal and intermediate directions. The African country geography charts are due on Friday. Africa maps are due Friday, September 12. We will continue our world history study of India. India directly affected ancient world history and still affects our country today.

- **7-8 History:** The colonies in North America were established by European countries that hoped to make money from America. The real value of the colonies, however, was their independent, hardworking people who risked everything, hoping to build a better life for themselves far from home.
 - **Literature:** Reading Skill: 8 basic parts of all stories - quiz Wednesday. We are starting the novel *Where the Red Fern Grows*. The students have a guide packet to fill out with each chapter. The students will be able to use their notes for quizzes on the novel. The first quiz is on Chapters 1-4 next week Tuesday.

Bible History/Hymnology: We will continue to open our Bible History class singing “By Faith” by Keith and Kristyn Getty. We are finishing Acts chapter 2. We will do activities in class as a review of these chapters.

7th Grade Literature: Throughout the year, we will be working on new vocabulary words. The students will receive a new list on the first day of every school week, and will have a quiz on the words the last week of the school week. Every week, students will be given a reading log to track their reading throughout the week. They are to read 140 minutes every week. The reading logs will be given on the first day of every school week and are due the following Monday. Parents/Guardians are required to sign the log every week. This week, the 7th graders will be studying Genres and making connections. They will be doing this by studying short stories.

5th Math: The class will continue to work on place value concepts. The new concept is the place values with decimals.

6th Math: The class will continue to work on numerical expressions and factors. This week they will focus especially on greatest common factors and least common multiples.

7th Math: The class will focus on subtracting integers and rational numbers.

8th Math: The class will continue to work on writing and solving equations. They will continue to solve multi-step equations with variables on one or both sides.

Special notes: The 7th grade students have gym at the end of the day on Thursday. If the students take their gym clothes home, please make sure they come back to school.

Science Notes for Middle School

-All students got to try out the Simulations that come with our Amplify science curriculum last week. These tools are helpful for getting “hands on” with concepts that would be difficult to bring into the classroom, like comparing the genetic traits of spiders (5&6) or how populations interact within an ecosystem (7&8). We will continue working with these tools this week. Also, the first feedback on science homework will be appearing in PowerSchool this week. For now, I’m marking everything as “completed” or “not completed” as the students learn my expectations for their work.

8th Grade Notes

-Students have had a few chances to practice and receive feedback on their assignments for religion and literature. As in science, I’ve only been marking assignments as “completed” or “not completed” in PowerSchool for work done so far. Soon, I will be adding grades to their work instead of just marking completion.

-A big reason for grades is to provide feedback to parents/guardians and students about the level of understanding that the student is demonstrating. I provide this feedback by writing feedback directly on the assignments and recording completion and grades on PowerSchool. I trust students to communicate with their parents about any notes giving reasoning for their grades on their assignments, and I trust parents/guardians to stay up-to-date with grades on PowerSchool. I am not likely to reach out to communicate about grades in another way, so please make contact with me if you are concerned about the direction a grade in a class is trending.

-Students have a study hall every day for at least 30 minutes which they can use to complete school work or ask for help from a teacher. Once their work is complete, they can use their time for individualized instruction in math and reading through our i-Ready program, practice their keyboarding skills through our typing program, or bring a book of their own to read in class.
