This Week's Focus:

Theme: My Body & Bones

Bible Lesson: God Keeps His Promise to Abraham

Fine Motor Development: Encouraging precise hand-eye coordination, such as when placing q-tips, using dot markers, and gluing body parts. These actions strengthen finger dexterity, control, and hand strength, which are crucial for tasks like writing and drawing.

Social/Language: Verbal interaction and collaboration. As children engage in pretend play or work together on projects like the body parts collage, they practice communication skills, express ideas, and follow directions. Additionally, activities like counting or discussing the steps involved help build vocabulary and support the development of sentence structure and social conversations.

Songs: Ba Ba Bones, Head Shoulders, Knees and Toes, My Body

Math: We will be doing counting and one-to-one correspondence through placing q-tips on a traced hand, recognizing and creating patterns with a rainbow dot marker worksheet, and developing spatial awareness and understanding shapes while assembling and coloring a full-body figure.

Science: Exploration of the human body, reinforcing concepts like anatomy and body parts through the hand and full-body projects, and fostering understanding of cause and effect as children observe how materials like q-tips, markers, and glue interact.

**This week we are focusing on circles and the colors of the rainbow.



What we are learning in 4th Grade:

Thoughts from God's Word

Daniel 6:4-8 “The administrators...could find no corruption in him, because he was trustworthy and neither corrupt nor negligent....We will find no basis for charges against this man, Daniel, unless it has something to do with the law of his God.”

We live in a world where we often do not trust government officials because we have seen many who have been corrupt or unfaithful in their government jobs. Daniel worked high up in the Persian government. He was so good at his job that other officials were jealous. When Daniel was investigated, they found that he was faithful and honest in all he did. If our lives were investigated, would people say the same thing about us? God searches and knows us inside out. There is nothing we can hide from him. We would have to admit that we are not faithful. In fact, we have been faithless in our dealings with God and each other. But God sees us through Christ's redemptive work and declares us to be holy and perfect. Like Daniel, may God help us to reflect that status in all we do.

Subject Work This Week

- **Bible History:** God kept his promise to Abraham and gave him a son. Isaac was not just any son but the one through whom God would send the Savior into the world.
- **Doctrine:** In the Second Commandment, God commands us to protect his good name and reputation. We do this not only by our speech but also by living lives that bring honor and glory to him.
- **Memory Work:** Monday - Passages 15-16; Wednesday - Passages 17-18; Thursday - the Second Commandment; next Monday - Passages 19-20
- **5-6 History/Geography:** We are studying cardinal and intermediate directions. There is a test on Friday. The African country economy charts are due on Friday. We will begin a study of Russia.
- **7-8 History:** The colonies in North America grew rapidly as new people from around the world settled in the colonies. Because Britain had minimal involvement in the colonies, they became fiercely independent. Projects are due on Friday, September 26.
- **Literature:** We are reading the novel *Where the Red Fern Grows*. The students have a guide packet to fill out with each chapter. The students will be able to use their notes for quizzes on the novel. The next quiz on Chapters 9-11 is on Monday.

Bible History/Hymnology: We will begin by praising God through the singing of our two worship songs before starting our review of Acts chapters 3 and 4, and the start of chapter 5. Ask your scholars to share what they have learned so far.

7th Grade Literature: We are excited to begin our first novel study of the year. The 7th grade class will be reading *Black Radishes* by Susan Lynn Meyer, a powerful historical novel set in Nazi-occupied France. This story not only offers engaging characters and a compelling plot, but it also provides meaningful opportunities to discuss themes such as courage, identity, and resilience. As we read, students will be challenged to think critically, make personal connections, and deepen their understanding of both history and literature.

5th Math: The class is currently focusing on writing numerical expressions and will continue by practicing how to evaluate expressions that include grouping symbols.

6th Math: The class is currently mastering the division of mixed numbers and will soon transition to adding and subtracting decimals.

7th Math: The class is currently working on converting between fractions and decimals, as well as multiplying rational numbers.

8th Math: The class will be reviewing subtracting integers and beginning a new study on slope.

Science Notes for Middle School

- The 7th and 8th grade classes are coming up on mid-unit assessments this week. I've started grading smaller assignments which take students ~10-15 minutes, but the assessment will be longer and account for more of the overall grade. 5th and 6th grade students have been annotating articles and building models of molecules to learn about genes, mutations, and traits.

8th Grade Notes

-We are continuing our study of Abraham this week, this time surrounding the birth and childhood of Isaac. Class will include the account from Genesis and also an excerpt from Hebrews 11 which provides some more insight into Abraham's relationship with God.

-We had a good conversation in Literature class on Friday about control. The students discussed whether Oberon was in control of Robin or not. One side said yes because Robin followed orders, but the other side said no because Oberon's orders were poor and didn't result the way he wanted. In addition to studying this theme, we are also learning about how the words and actions of characters reveal aspects of their personality.

-We started Memory Work this week. Right now, we will have about one passage per week. Students are expected to recite the passage to the teacher before Friday. If not recited by Friday, students will write the passage from memory before chapel starts. They will also answer questions about the passage based on discussions from the end-of-the-day devotions.

-If you're reading this on Monday, there's a good chance that your student is at Camp Phillip! Big thanks to the volunteers for chaperoning. I'm sure everyone is behaving and getting along together just fine.
